## Updates/Information:

We acknowledge that there has been some tension at some of our SAC meetings. Our goal as a collective is to support the students and school. There may be times where SAC members disagree and that is ok, however; we need to find ways to move forward in positive, collaborative ways so as to best support the students and school.

School Learning Plan- Individual EQAO student results are in the process of being sent home. As a staff we will spend time analyzing EQAO data in conjunction with other sources of data - report card, Our School Survey data and classroom assessment data to begin the process of writing the goals that will make up our School Learning
Plan. Our EQAO results showed growth in all areas of the assessment in both the primary and junior assessments.

Implementing changes to the health curriculum.
There are no changes for secondary students in grades 9 to 12 . Secondary teachers will continue to teach the 2015 health and physical education curriculum as is. The government of Ontario, however, has directed all school boards across the province to use the interim 2010 health and physical education curriculum for elementary students in grades 1 to 8 . You can visit the LDSB website and click on 'Implementing changes to health curriculum' and in there you will find a link to the interim 2010 health and physical education curriculum. Once the school board receives resource documents from the ministry, they will be shared with elementary teachers. You will find further information by visiting the LDSB website that will address how staff will continue to support students to develop healthy relationships, free of racism, bullying and homophobia, supported through our equity and inclusion principles. Please be assured that we will continue to support our students emotional, mental and physical needs in a safe and inclusive environment.

Boomerang lunches are happening in classes and we will send home further clarification to families. The idea of waste free lunches or 'boomerang lunches' helps to educates students, families and staff about food waste in our world and the importance of this environmental issue. This also helps families to know what they children are eating throughout the day.
